Logan domestic violence shelter prepares for 22nd Annual Golf Tournament Fundraiser

LOGAN, Utah – April 18, 2009 – Community Abuse Prevention Services Agency (CAPSA), a domestic violence and rape shelter in Logan, Utah, is gearing up for its annual golf tournament fundraiser on Monday, June 1, 2007 – the largest fundraiser of the year.
