Logan domestic violence shelter seeking volunteers to help local victims

LOGAN, Utah – April 16, 2009 – CAPSA, a domestic violence shelter in Logan, Utah, is seeking volunteers from the community who are interested in helping local victims of domestic violence and sexual assault. All volunteers are required to complete 40 hours of training and can volunteer to help in many different areas, including answering the crisis hotline, working as a mobile crisis response team advocate, and collecting and organizing donations.

Volunteer training begins Tuesday, May 5. Training occurs on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday evenings between 5:30 and 9:30. Call Ruth at 435.753.2500 to schedule an interview. Volunteers must be at least 18 years of age and must submit to a voluntary annual background check.
