Logan domestic violence shelter raises over \$23,000 from 23rd Annual Golf Tournament Fundraiser

LOGAN, Utah – June 18, 2010 – Community Abuse Prevention Services Agency (CAPSA), a domestic violence and rape shelter in Logan, Utah, raised just over \$23,000 at the 23rd Annual Golf Tournament, its largest fundraiser of the year.

Sponsorships for the event came from local businesses and community supporters, and 23 foursome teams golfed in the event. Golfers participated in an 18 hole course at the Logan Golf & Country Club on Monday, June 7th, 2010.

In past years, the CAPSA Golf Tournament has raised as much as \$37,000 to help support domestic violence and rape victims in Cache and Rich counties.

“We know this has been a difficult year for many companies, donors, and supporters,” said Jill Anderson, CAPSA Executive Director. “We appreciate those who were able to donate what they could spare to help our organization get through these tough times.”

The money raised at fundraisers like the Annual Golf Tournament is vital for filling in the gaps where grants and other funding sources will not pay, like infrastructure costs, building maintenance, and basic needs like paper towels, toilet paper, and groceries for sheltered clients.
